## What is BrowZine?

All our journals are available electronically. Open BrowZine and search for a specific journal title or journals in a specific specialty. From the list of journals, click the journal you want to read. To open the full-text of an article, click the article and login with your NHS Athens account.

BrowZine is available online or via their app, which can be downloaded from your app store.

## NHS Athens

Create a free NHS Athens account (sometimes called OpenAthens) for full-text access to our journals, e-books, databases and other online library resources.



# Creating a personal account

Create a free BrowZine account to save a **bookshelf** of your favourite journals and articles. Each time you login any new articles in your saved journals will be flagged for your attention. You can arrange the journals and articles onto different bookcases, so you can organise your references into different interest areas, research projects, etc. Create your account via Settings in the top-right corner.



# Using BrowZine

The journal title and front cover

Sometimes access to recent issues are embargoed

By default it displays the current issue

Click on an article title if you want to view the full-text. You will then be prompted for your **NHS Athens** username and password.

Click 'Change year' to browse to a particular issue

Click on an issue to open it

Any issues which we don't have access to the full-text will have a padlock symbol next to them. If there is no padlock we have access to the full-text.

Click the 'expand' arrow if you would like to save the citation to a reference manager software package, or to share the article via social media or email.

# LibKey Nomad

LibKey Nomad is a free web browser extension which provides quick, easy access to our full-text content. When you are searching scholarly websites the LibKey Nomad extension will show you if the article is available via our full-text subscriptions, with a button to directly access the full-text. If an article isn't available in full-text LibKey Nomad will provide a pre-populated form allowing you to seamlessly request the article from the library. More information:
